Rise and Shine

In his Gospel John wrote, "In [Jesus] was life, and that life was the light of men" (John 1:4). The prophet Isaiah some 700 years earlier foretold the Messiah by saying, "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and His glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn" (Isaiah 60:1-3).

Darkness covers the earth—darkness so thick we cannot see our own way, but Isaiah encourages us, "The Lord rises upon [us]." No longer do we

grope our way. No longer are we left to our own wisdom and resources. No

longer do we live in despair. No, we "Arise," and "shine," for our light has come upon us!

The night of His birth, the sky was filled with light as the angels brought the message of good news to the shepherds. The bright star in the East continued to shine to guide the Wise Men to the Christ Child that they might worship Him.

Jesus, the Light of the World, continues to draw us to Himself, and, as we reflect the light of Christ in our lives, others will see that light and be drawn to Him.



John the Baptist, sent from God, witnessed to the light of Christ. As individual Christians, we have a responsibility to do what John did, to testify to "the true light that gives light to every man" (John 1:9). Each of us has been individually gifted and equipped to work together within the whole body of Christ that we might testify to Christ, "the light [Who] shines in the darkness." (John 1:5).

As you reflect during this Advent season on all that Jesus has done for you, pray that the same grace and love **that moved** John the Baptist to tell others about Jesus move your heart to share the Good News with others.

More Blessed to Give

Have you ever become really excited about giving a gift to someone? For a birthday or at Christmas you were so excited that you could hardly wait for the person receiving the present to open it. Do you remember how proud you felt when the recipient opened the gift and was so happy and thankful to receive it? Then, when you saw that person use or wear your present, you beamed with pleasure because you had given it.

Giving gifts can be fun, and it is an activity that as Christians we are called to do. Jesus said in Acts 20:35, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." If you have had the experience related above, you know what Jesus meant.

Giving is part of life. Parents constantly give to their children. Teachers give care, attention, wisdom, and information. God created things in nature for your use and enjoyment that keep on giving: the sun gives energy, the clouds rain down moisture, cornfields share their nutrients, and apple trees bear their fruit.

God Who loves you receives more joy in giving to you than you can imagine. He knows you by name. He gives you food to eat, clothes to wear, and a warm place to sleep. It is God Who has given you life and the world to live in.

The prophet Jeremiah wrote that God also has a plan for you—a plan to

God uses us to help provide for the needs of others so that we, too, may experience the joy of giving. As His stewards, we are merely His conduits through which He feeds the hungry, shelters the homeless, and provides clothes for the naked. Through His grace, He will give us all that we need so that we "will abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8).
